| Sat March 13th 2010 | Eastnor Park and Malvern Hills South - Local Event
A MADO Mini League event, with Yellow, Orange, Green and Blue courses. Co-hosted with the Herefordshire and Worcestershire Schools Championships. |
| Sat March 27th 2010 | Frith Wood (Near Ledbury) – Night Event
An opportunity for “after dark” enthusiasts to visit Frith Wood. This event is incorporated into the Western Night League. |
| Sun March 28th 2010 | Dudmaston (Near Bridgnorth) - Local Event
Delightful National Trust Woodlands. Undulating mixed forest with lakes and a good path network. Colour Coded courses up to Blue. |
| Sat April 17th 2010 | Sandwell Valley (West Bromwich) - Local Event
This area always surprises, as an extensive area of open countryside right by the M5/M6 Junction. It is mainly flat, with extensive paths and lakes. Combine with a visit to the restored 18 th century farm, visitor centre and tea rooms. |
| Thurs April 22nd 2010 | Baggeridge (Near Wombourne) – Summer Evening Event
Opening event of our 2010 SEE season. Country Park. |
| Thurs April 29th 2010 | Pitcher Oak Wood (Redditch) – Summer Evening Event
A “Country Park” which is contained within Redditch. Mainly wooded, with a complex path and ditch system. |
| Thurs May 6th 2010 | Himley Park (Near Wombourne) – Summer Evening Event
The area comprises the pleasant parkland with its lake and the wooded hillside (with crags) above the Hall. |
| Sun May 16th 2010 | Kinver Edge (Near Stourbridge) – Regional Event
Make a note now for this event, on one of HOC’s classic areas. Kinver has wooded hillsides, plenty of contour detail, and a wealth of rock features – including the famous Rock Houses. |
