This area of land 39 acres and 34 perches lying, at the time, some distance from the town was left by **William Morton Stanley** to the people of Redditch and Webheath. He was a local businessman successful in the town's fish hook and needle industry and he designated the land be protected and used as a park.

(Not the **Sir Henry Morton Stanley**, GCB, born **John Rowlands** (28 January 1841 – 10 May 1904), who was a Welsh journalist and explorer famous for his exploration of Africa and "Dr. Livingstone, I presume?")
